Commerce Park Clubhouse is a place that offers a sense of belonging, hope, and opportunities for people living with mental illness.

Through participation in the "work-ordered day," members build meaningful relationships and identify talents, skills, and interests.



What We Do.

The Clubhouse is a psychiatric and vocational rehabilitation program for adults. Members of the Clubhouse participate in the operation and decision-making of the Clubhouse alongside with staff, creating opportunities for them to regain a sense of self worth, purpose, and confidence. We also offer opportunities for members to obtain paid employment in integrated work settings and provide assistance to those who want to further their education through adult literacy support, college, and post-secondary or vocational training programs.

How It Works.

Our work-ordered day consists of meaningful skill-driven tasks designed to foster teamwork, encourage new experiences, and build self-confidence. By working together, members can gain skills that are useful for finding and maintaining employment as well as gaining more independence in their daily lives. We are also open one evening a week for recreational activities and on all major holidays.

Accessing Services.

- Who is eligible for clubhouse membership? Membership is open to anyone 18 or older, living in Clinton or Lycoming county, and has been diagnosed with a mental illness.
- How is membership funded? Commerce Park accepts Medicaid insurance and/or funding support through Lycoming and Clinton Counties.
